NEW BUSINESS

Discussion of where and when to have the 2017 Annual Meeting. Given that our options in Prescott (with Embry-Riddle), which at one time looked promising, fizzled, the only location with active board members known to be available this spring is GCC. Only date available is April 1st. Although the earlier date may pose a challenge as far as time to complete research, we will announce early and hope for the best since no other locations seem do-able. Hopefully proximity will get us a good turn out from ASU, GCC, MWU. Fairly central location amongst all active institutions. Discussed a few possible options related to displaying posters. Yuma was mentioned as a possible location for a meeting in the more distant future.

By-laws Changes: Amended bylaws were posted to website and membership notified by email of this on August 16, 2016 as stipulated by bylaws section 13.00. Draft attached. Membership was given option to participate in this virtual Business Meeting in person or to allow the board to vote their proxy to approve (see email communication attached). We received no objections to changes in advance of the meeting. Theo made motion to accept changes to by-laws as written; motion seconded and approved by acclimation.

Update on Changes to Science Olympiad. With the approval of Nationals, this event was handed off to the former Division B Director to organize a combined B/C tournament that will be hosted by ASU. (Email re: Special Business Meeting attached provides more details). New director and her board required that ANAS remove all references to the Science Olympiad on our website, bank accounts, by-laws and our affiliation with it. With this by-law change have met all her stipulations and communicated this to her. We never received confirmation that all terms had been met and that she was assuming responsibility for C tournament; however, their website has information for both B and C teams. We are awaiting their receipt of tax ID# and nonprofit status before we transfer \$5000 in operational funds to them. We will retain endowed funds in a renamed bank account (ANAS-Science Olympiad → ANAS-Tournament Endowment Fund) and use these funds to continue honorary awards (e.g., Ellis Award, Hoyt Honorarium) and travel grants to high school teams club accounts. These checks will be sent to teams separate from the tournament itself. Board could also choose to support other high school science tournaments (e.g., New Mexico Science Olympiad, Science Bowl) in the future.

Hello ANAS members --

As reported in the 2016 Proceedings volume by the Science Olympiad Liaison (see attached), the Arizona Science Olympiad program is being consolidated with the junior high school tournament under a new director and a new non-profit organization. This change in operational organization will necessitate a few changes in our bylaws, and given the immediacy of the reorganization, the board felt it was important to vote on these changes prior to our next Annual Business meeting.

Thus, a special Business meeting will be convened by conference call on September 17th at 10 am to vote on the proposed amendments to the bylaws. As a current member of the Academy, your in-person participation is encouraged. If you prefer, you can assign your proxy to the ANAS Board of Governors.

Please review the proposed bylaw changes on the ANAS website. Changes are noted in red (with deletions to the current version being demarcated by strike-through). As per the terms of our current policies (Section 13), you are being given the required 30-day review period prior to this special business meeting.

Dial-in instructions for conference call will be forthcoming. Members who do not "join the meeting" to vote in-person will be assumed to approve the amended bylaws "as written" unless we receive email expressing dissent, recommended edits, concerns, or questions in advance of that meeting.

Please note that in contrast to what was reported in the Proceedings, the Science Olympiad web pages will no longer be hosted on the ANAS website. To minimize confusion, there will be a single "stand alone" Arizona Science Olympiad website established by the new State Director and her governing board for the combined junior high and high school programs. Our archive of HTML files for the Science Olympiad have been transferred from ANAS to new webmaster so that record of ANAS's historical affiliation with the program can be preserved.

Similarly, the tentative transition plan originally reported to ANAS members in April has been revised at the request of the new leadership such that the proposed amendments remove specific mention of the Arizona Science Olympiad tournament from the Academy's bylaws. If these policy changes are approved by the membership, the new non-profit will assume those responsibilities and develop their own bylaws to reflect that new relationship.

The amendments also propose that the funds endowed to the Science Olympiad program be retained by the Academy in a "Tournament Endowment Fund." These moneys would be used at the discretion of the ANAS Board of Governors in support of STEM-related activities for high school students in the southwest; this would include but not be restricted to the Science Olympiad program. (See Bylaw revision sections: 9.50)

Please let me know if you have any questions. Otherwise we look forward to your participation in this vote (either in-person or by proxy). A reminder email will be sent along with dial-in instructions for those who choose to be part of the virtual meeting (conference call).

ARIZONA SCIENCE OLYMPIAD – DIVISION C


The 2016 state tournament was held on Saturday March 5th at Glendale Community College. Thirty-two teams from 24 high schools (nearly 500 students plus their teacher/coaches) competed in the 25 different events that comprise the tournament at state and national level. The events covered the usual full spectrum of STEM-related disciplines. The Science Olympiad is distinct from other academic competition in that it is much more than a test of students' accumulated knowledge of obscure scientific factoids; instead its events really demand that students engage in a process of scientific inquiry and investigation. Team success requires thoughtful preparation, collaborative effort, perseverance, mutual respect, and creative problem solving

In addition to several ANAS members helping out as event supervisors and assistants (Rob Bowker, Pedro Chavez, Ty Ferre, Pamela Marshall, Florence Slater and Jim Tuohy), the Academy also donates funds annually towards the supply costs of teams participating in two new events (Evolution and Robot Arm in 2016) as well as to recognize the top teams in two natural history-related events (GeoLogic Mapping and Invasive Species) in memory of Bud Ellis.

The day culminates with the Awards Ceremony; ribbons and medallions are awarded to the top seven places in each of the events as well as plaques and trophies to the top teams overall. In the end, Catalina Foothills High School's Blue team (from Tucson; coached by Aaron Steindler) regained their top position and will be representing Arizona at the National competition at the University of Wisconsin-Stout (UWS) in mid-May.

Arizona Science Olympiad

2016 was the last year that the Arizona Division C tournament will be held separately from Division B (Middle/Junior High School); as is the case already in most states, starting in 2017, the two divisions will be combined into a single event that will be held on ASU's Tempe campus. The 2017 tournament will be held on March 25th.

While some operational dollars from the Science Olympiad account will be transferred to seed the combined tournament next year, ANAS will retain funds given specifically to Division C. Based on the recommendation of the board, the Academy remains committed to its affiliation with the high school competition and will continue its funding of the team awards per current budget along with the gradual spending down of the Science Olympiad endowment moneys for grants and awards such as Charles Hoyt Honorarium (to assist state winner with funds needed to participate at nationals), student prizes, coach recognitions, "start-up" funds for new teams, team travel, and/or coaches training. As an affiliated program, the Science Olympiad will continue to be part of the ANAS By-laws (sections 5.4, 6.8 and 12.3), it will retain a presence on the Academy's website (https://www.aznvas.org/SO), and Academy members may continue to volunteer to assist with the state tournament. Academy members are encouraged to consider donating their state income tax credit (\$200 per year for individual or \$400 for married couple) to a local high school with a team. Update from 2015 Tournaments:

The Maroon team from Desert Mountain High School, coached by Joshua Pantier, represented Arizona at the national Science Olympiad May 15-16 at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. They came in 49th out of 60 teams – a good job for this school's first trip to the stiff competition of Nationals. Perhaps most exciting was the unexpected announcement that the DMHS team had won the national tournament's Spirit Award for the high school division – a first for our state. This prestigious award was a sweet reward after a rather contentious state tournament last year and well deserved as this team truly embodied the spirit of friendly competition, teamwork, and good sportsmanship that is at the core of the Science Olympiad program. Arizona - Nevada Academy of Science BY-LAWS

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Academy is to foster scientific research and education, disseminate scientific knowledge, promote collegial relationships among scientists from a variety of disciplines, assist in developing the scientific resources of the region, encourage the publication of research-based reports, and unify the scientific interests of the southwestern U.S.

1.00 -- **NAME**

- 1.10 -- The name of the corporation is the **ARIZONA-NEVADA ACADEMY OF SCIENCE** (also referred to in this document as ANAS and/or the Academy).
- 1.20 -- It is the intent of this organization to be a non-profit corporation devoted to promoting scientific research and education.

2.00 -- ORGANIZATION

2.10 – The organizational structure of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science shall consists of the following:

Membership -- section 3.00

Board of Governors -- sections 5.00 – 8.00

Committees -- section 11.00

Affiliated organizations -- section 12.00

3.00 – MEMBERSHIP

- 3.10 Membership Dues
 - 3.11--The amount of the annual dues for all membership categories shall be is established by the Board of Governors.

- 3.12 -- Annual dues for the ensuing year shall be are due on January 1.
- 3.13 -- Any dues-paying member in arrears for one year shall will be dropped from the roll of members, provided he or she has had at least one notice of the indebtedness sent to him or her via e-mail at the last address on record. Upon payment of current dues, the individual will be reinstated.
- 3.20 -- **Regular Members** -- Persons 18 years or older who are interested in science may apply for membership.
 - 3.21 -- The Board of Governors shall have has the right to expel or suspend a member after a hearing at which the member has the right to be present in person. The member in question shall will be notified by registered mail two months prior to the hearing.
 - 3.22 -- A majority vote of all members of the Board of Governors shall be is necessary to expel or suspend a member, and an appeal of the decision may be made to the members of the Academy at the next Annual Business Meeting.
 - 3.23 -- A majority vote of the members present at an appeals meeting shall be is required to reverse the decision of the Board of Governors.
- 3.30-- **Family Members** -- Two persons living at the same address may receive ANAS mailings (one copy), such as the Journal, as Family Members. Each family member otherwise has individual privileges of membership including voting.
- 3.40-- **Student Members** -- Students 18 years of age or older who are regularly enrolled at a college or university as an undergraduate or graduate student may have voting and other privileges of membership at a reduced rate until they complete their degree or otherwise leave the institution.
- 3.50 -- **Life Members** -- Any regular member who contributes to the Endowment Fund of the Academy a sum established by the Board of Governors to yield interest equal to or greater than the current annual dues for a regular member shall be is identified as a Life Member and be is exempt from payment of all regular dues thereafter.

- 3.60 -- **Sustaining Members** Any Rregular members paying not less than three times the regular annual dues shall be is identified as a Sustaining Member.
- 3.70 -- **Fellows** -- Any regular member who has been a regular or sustaining member of the Academy for not less than five years and who has successfully engaged in reputable scientific work and/or has made significant contributions to the Academy may be nominated as a Fellow by the Fellows Committee.
 - 3.71 -- A majority vote of the membership present at the Annual Meeting shall be is necessary to confirm the invitation to become a Fellow of the Academy.
- 3.80 -- **Honorary Members** -- Any person who has contributed extraordinary service to the advancement of science may be elected to honorary membership in the Academy.
 - 3.81 -- Nominations may be made in writing by any current member of the Academy who, upon approval of the Board of Governors, shall presents the nominee at the Annual Business Meeting. A majority vote of the members present shall be is necessary to confirm the invitation to honorary membership. Ordinarily not more than one honorary member shall be is elected in any one year.
 - 3.82 -- An honorary member is exempt from the payment of annual dues. He/She is a non-voting member and cannot hold office in the Academy unless he/she is also a regular or sustaining member.
- 3.90 -- **Patrons** -- Any firm, institution, or business organization wishing to contribute to the ongoing work of the Academy may apply to the Membership Secretary for patron membership in the Academy. Approval by the Board of Governors shall be is required. necessary for election.
 - 3.91 -- The annual dues for a patron member shall be is one hundred dollars (\$100.00). The initial dues shall be are to be submitted with the membership application.
 - 3.92 -- A patron is a non-voting member of the Academy.

- 3.100 -- **Member Emeritus** -- Any member who has reached the age of 65 and/or is retired and who has maintained continuous membership in any active category in the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science for at least seventeen (17) years may apply for the status of Member Emeritus. The Board of Governors shall, upon verifiesying that the applicant meets these requirements, and changes the status of the member to Emeritus.
 - 3.101 -- The Member Emeritus shall have has all of the privileges of membership, but will be is relieved of all charges and dues applied to other members of the Academy.

3.110 – Benefits and Privileges of Membership

- 3.111 All voting membership categories have a voice in selection of members of Board of Governors, approval of Fellows and Honorary Members, revisions to by-laws, and other voting matters brought to the general membership by the Board of Governors at the Annual Business Meeting.
- 3.112 -- Current Academy members receive printed copies of the Journal of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science, access to electronic archives of all volumes of the Journal, discounted page charges for publication, and reduced registration fees for the Annual Meeting. They also receive electronic notification of online publications, annual membership renewal reminders and other important announcements

3.120 – Suspension of Membership

- 3. 121 -- The Board of Governors shall have has the right to expel or suspend a member after a hearing at which the member has the right to be present in person. The member in question shall will be notified by registered mail two months prior to the hearing.
- 3.122 -- A majority vote of all members of the Board of Governors shall be is necessary to expel or suspend a member, and an appeal of the decision may be made to the members of the Academy at the next Annual Business Meeting.
- 3. 123 -- A majority vote of the members present at an appeals meeting shall be is required to reverse the decision of the Board of Governors.

3.130 – Member contact information

- 3.131 -- Demographic information (including affiliated institution, US mail and email addresses) will be solicited when individuals enroll or renew as members.
- 3.132 -- It is the responsibility of the member to update the membership secretary if his/her address changes between annual renewals. Members who fail to do so may not receive their print copies of the Academy's journal and/or important communication from the Board of Governors.

4.00 -- **MEETINGS**

- 4.10 -- A regular Annual Meeting of the membership shall be is held at a time and place determined by the Board of Governors. Special meetings may also be held.
 - 4.11 -- Prior to each Annual Meeting of the Academy, the Board of Governors and the chairpersons of standing committees will hold a planning meeting at which the agenda for the Annual Meeting will be is arranged. Ideally, this planning meeting will be is held at the site of the next Annual Meeting of the Academy.
 - 4.12 -- Notices of the Annual Meeting and all special meetings of the Academy shall are to be sent to all members at least one month in advance of the date of the meeting.
- 4.20 -- The regular members present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum.
- 4.30 -- The order of business at agenda of the regular Annual Meetings shall be as follows the order of business listed below:
 - Call to Order by the President
 - Reading of minutes from the previous Annual Meeting
 - Reports of officers
 - Election of Honorary Members and Fellows
 - o Business
 - Reports of Committees
 - Election of officers
 - Assumption of the Presidency by the President-Elect
 - Adjournment

5.00 -- **OFFICERS**

- 5.10 -- The officers of the Academy, who also constitute the Board of Governors, shall be are the President, President-Elect, Past President, Recording Secretary, Membership Secretary, Treasurer, Regional Directors (5), Editor of Journal, Editor of the Newsletter, Editor of the Proceedings, Permanent Secretary, and Webmaster.
 - 5.11 -- One dDirector shall be is chosen from each of the four geographical regions of Southern Arizona, Central Arizona, Northern Arizona and Nevada.
 - 5.12 -- An additional fifth director (the Director at Large) will be is chosen from anywhere in Arizona or Nevada as needed.
- 5.20 -- The Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and Membership Secretary shall hold office for one year and the Directors shall hold office for two years. They shall be are elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting and shall hold office until a successor is elected.
- 5.30-- The President-Elect, President, and Past President shall hold office for two years, or until replaced by their successors.
 - 5.31 -- The President-Elect shall automatically becomes President at the convening of the Annual Meeting at which a new President-Elect is chosen. Subsequent to that election, the President-Elect shall takes over as President and the retiring President shall becomes Past President.
 - 5.32 -- The President shall be is the ex-officio Chairperson of the Board of Governors.
- 5.40 -- An Editor of the Journal, Editor of the Newsletter, Editor of the Proceedings, Science Olympiad Representative, and Webmaster shall be are appointed by the Board of Governors and shall hold office for three years, or until replaced by their successors.
- 5.50 -- Officers of the Academy shall perform the duties as specified in the parliamentary authority adopted by the Academy and as defined in the Articles of Incorporation and these by-laws.

6.00 -- DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

6.10 -- **PRESIDENT**

- 6.11 -- The President shall presides over all meetings of the Academy and the Board of Governors. The President shall be is responsible for the administration of all activities of the Academy and shall cause ensures that provisions of the by-laws to be are executed.
- 6.12 -- The President shall appoints all standing committees subject to confirmation of the Board of Governors. The President shall be is an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.

6.20 -- PRESIDENT ELECT

- 6.21 -- The President-Elect shall, iIn the absence of the President, The President-Elect shall, presides over all meetings of the Academy and the Board of Governors.
- 6.22 -- The President-Elect shall appoints the chairpersons of the local arrangements committee at the institution hosting the annual meeting.
- 6.23 -- The President-Elect shall recruits new Patron Members for the Academy.
- 6.24 -- The President-Elect shall participates in public relations activities for the Academy.

6.30 -- PAST PRESIDENT

6.31 -- The Past President shall serves on the Board of Governors and shall, in the absence of the President and President-Elect, presides over all meetings of the Academy and the Board of Governors.

6.40 -- RECORDING SECRETARY

6.41 -- The Recording Secretary shall keeps a record of all meetings of the Academy and of the Board of Governors.

- 6.42 The minutes kept by the Recording Secretary shall are to include a record of actions approved by the Board of Governors.
- 6.43 The Recording Secretary shall makes electronic copies of the minutes available to the membership.
- 6.44 -- The Recording Secretary shall provides a copy of the minutes from the previous year's Annual Business Meeting to the Editor of the Proceedings.

6.50 -- MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

- 6.51 -- The Membership Secretary shall keeps the membership records of the Academy.
- 6.52 -- The Membership Secretary shall prepares and sends notices of dues and shall keeps a record of the dues paid by the members and their contact information.
- 6.53 -- The Membership Secretary shall prepares and sends renewal notices to all institutional subscribers to of the Journal of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science and shall keeps a record of fees paid.
- 6.54 -- The Membership Secretary shall provides mailing labels to the Editor of the Journal and the Editor of the Proceedings for mailing of the Journal and *Proceedings of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science*. Proceedings of the Arizona Nevada Academy of Science Annual Meeting.
- 6.55 -- The Membership Secretary shall sends copies of recent issues of the Journal to members and libraries that did not receive their copy with the regular mailing.
- 6.56 -- The Membership Secretary shall presents to the Board of Governors a report on the current membership of the Academy as of the end of the calendar year.
- 6.57 -- The Membership Secretary obtains the abbreviated Annual Meeting agenda from the Editor of the Proceedings and sends it to the membership.

6.58 –The Membership Secretary sends notice of any voting matters to the membership at least 30 days in advance of the Annual Business Meeting.

6.60 -- **TREASURER**

- 6.61 -- The Treasurer shall receives, deposits and disburses all funds of the Academy as stipulated by Section 9.00 of these by-laws.
- 6.62 -- The Treasurer shall keeps an detailed accounting of all receipts and disbursements in detail, and at the Annual Meeting shall presents a report of these transactions receipts and disbursements during for the previous fiscal year at the Annual Meeting.
- 6.63 -- The Treasurer shall, at the Annual Business Meeting, presents to the Board of Governors an annual report of the current financial status of the Academy at all board meetings.
- 6.64 -- The Treasurer shall prepares an Annual Operating Budget and shall present the Operating Budget for the fiscal year to the Board of Governors at their January meeting.
- 6.65 -- The Treasurer shall see ensures that appropriate tax forms are filed with the IRS.
- 6.66 The Treasurer shall holds all of the important documents of the Academy including but not limited to incorporation papers, IRS documents, annual report to the Corporation Commission, and financial records.

6.70 -- EDITOR OF THE JOURNAL

- 6.71 -- The Editor shall manages the publication of the *Journal of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science*.
- 6.72 The Editor of the Journal shall, with the approval of the Board of Governors, establishes an editorial policy.
- 6.73 The Editor of the Journal shall, with input from peer reviewers, evaluates the merits of manuscripts submitted for

publication in a timely manner and assembles two issues per volume.

- 6.74 The Editor of the Journal shall works with the Membership Secretary to distribute printed issues to current members and subscribing institutions and to manage subscription renewals.
- 6.75 The Editor of the Journal shall works with the Webmaster to get each issue digitally archived with an electronic repository.
- 6.76 The Editor of the Journal shall works with the Treasurer to insure that authors are appropriately billed for page charges.

6.80 -- SCIENCE OLYMPIAD REPRESENTATIVE

- 6.81 -- The Science Olympiad Representative will serves as the liaison between the Academy and the Board of Directors of the Arizona Science Olympiad, Division C (SO-C).
- 6.82 -- Duties of the representative will be are to (a) keep the ANAS informed about SO-C activities; (b) encourage involvement of ANAS membership in the state tournament and/or team preparation; (c) solicit ANAS members to serve as event supervisors; (d) recommend awards to be sponsored by the Academy, and (e) provide a year-end report to summarize the results of the state tournament.

6.90 -- **DIRECTORS**

- 6.91 -- The Directors shall promote the goals of the Academy to institutions in their geographical area.
- 6.92 The Directors serve as representatives of their respective regions and will inform and advise the Board of Governors and the membership of their regions' scientific activities and needs at meetings and via the Academy's website and social media.
- 6.93 -- The Directors shall promote membership in the Academy and shall encourage members and non-members to submit papers to the Journal and present research results at the Annual Meeting.

6.100 EDITOR OF THE NEWSLETTER

6.101 The Editor of the Newsletter shall be appointed by the President and shall issue newsletters to advise the membership of current activities of the members and other scientific events of the region.

6.102 The Editor of the Newsletter shall, in conjunction with the Editor of the Proceedings, prepare and send the abbreviated Annual Meeting agenda to the membership and registrants.

6.103 The Editor of the Newsletter shall send notice of any voting matters to the membership at least 30 days in advance of the Annual Business Meeting.

6.104 The Editor of the Newsletter shall submit reports to the national newsletter of the National Association of Academies of Science.

6.110 100 -- EDITOR OF THE PROCEEDINGS

6.—111 101 -- The Editor of the Proceedings shall, with the approval of the Board of Governors, schedules deadlines to insure the timely publication of the *Proceedings of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science*. Proceedings of the Arizona Nevada Academy of Science Annual Meeting.

6.112 102 -- The Editor of the Proceedings shall serves as a member of the Program Committee for the Annual Meeting and shall coordinates with session chairs to solicit, collect and organize abstracts to meet publication timeline.

6.—113 103 -- The Editor of the Proceedings shall prepares a list of abstracts to be presented at the Annual Meeting and the times of presentation. This abbreviated agenda shall be is forwarded to the Membership Secretary, Editor of the Newsletter the Section Chairs, and Webmaster to be sent to all members and registrants as part of the Newsletter and published on the Academy's website.

6.114 104 – The Editor of the Proceedings shall mails copies to the subscribing institutions and members who request copies.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Academy is to foster scientific research and education, disseminate scientific knowledge, promote collegial relationships among scientists from a variety of disciplines, assist in developing the scientific resources of the region, encourage the publication of research-based reports, and unify the scientific interests of the southwestern U.S.

1.00 -- **NAME**

- 1.10 -- The name of the corporation is the **ARIZONA-NEVADA ACADEMY OF SCIENCE** (also referred to in this document as ANAS and/or the Academy).
- 1.20 -- It is the intent of this organization to be a non-profit corporation devoted to promoting scientific research and education.

2.00 -- ORGANIZATION

2.10 – The organizational structure of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science consists of the following:

Membership -- section 3.00

Board of Governors -- sections 5.00 – 8.00

Committees -- section 11.00

Affiliated organizations -- section 12.00

3.00 – **MEMBERSHIP**

- 3.10 Membership Dues
 - 3.11--The amount of the annual dues for all membership categories is established by the Board of Governors.
 - 3.12 -- Annual dues for the ensuing year are due on January 1.

- 3.13 -- Any dues-paying member in arrears for one year will be dropped from the roll of members, provided he or she has had at least one notice of the indebtedness sent to him or her e-mail at the last address on record. Upon payment of current dues, the individual will be reinstated.
- 3.20 -- **Regular Members** -- Persons 18 years or older who are interested in science may apply for membership.
 - 3.21 -- The Board of Governors has the right to expel or suspend a member after a hearing at which the member has the right to be present in person. The member in question will be notified by registered mail two months prior to the hearing.

The votes are then received and counted by the Recording Secretary and added to the votes of the members present at the meeting. The President then declares each measure to pass or fail and announce the results to all voting members of the Board of Governors.
- 7.50 -- Approval of the Board of Governors is construed to mean a majority approval except where indicated otherwise.

8.00 -- **ELECTIONS**

- 8.10 -- Officers are elected at the business meeting of the Annual Meeting.
- 8.20 -- The Nominating Committee consists of the Director from each region and the Past President. The Past President functions as the committee chairperson.
 - 8.21 -- One month prior to the Annual Meeting, the Nominating Committee sends a report of these nominations to the Editor of the Proceedings for inclusion in the Proceedings volume.
 - 8.22 -- Additional nominations may be made from the floor by any dues-paying or emeritus member.
 - 8.23 -- Each nominee expresses his or her willingness to serve in the office for which he or she is being nominated before acceptance of his or her nomination.
- 8.30 -- The nominee for each office receiving the majority of votes of the regular members present is elected.

9.00 -- **ACCOUNTS**

- 9.10 -- The fiscal year of the Academy ends on December 31.
- 9.20 -- Three Academy accounts are maintained: General Fund and Academy Endowment Fund and Tournament Endowment Fund.

9.30 – General Fund

- 9.31-- The General Fund, consists of general membership dues payments, journal subscriptions, page charges and revenue from electronic repositories, and any other general-purpose funds received.
- 9.32 The General Fund is used for the Academy's operational budget.

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- 9.41 The Academy Endowment Fund consists of life membership dues, at least half of the patron membership dues, and any donations received for this account.
- 9.42 The principal balance of this Endowment Fund remains invested in a secured account(s).
- 9.43 The interest on this fund may be reinvested or transferred to the General Fund to be disbursed at the discretion of the Board of Governors in support of the Academy's mission and goals.

9.50 – Tournament Endowment Fund

- 9.51 Funds previously granted to the ANAS by endowments and private donations in support of the Academy sponsored statewide competitions for high school students in Arizona will be retained by the Academy in a Tournament Endowment Fund.
- 9. 52 This Endowment Fund will be invested in secured account(s) and its principal disbursed at discretion of the ANAS Board of Governors in annual increments to support STEM-related competitions for high school students in the region.
- 9.53 If and when all endowment moneys and future contributions to this fund are spent, this account will be closed.

10.00 -- PUBLICATIONS

- 10.10 Current publications of the Academy include the *Journal of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science*, the *Proceedings of the Arizona-Nevada Academy of Science*, and *Hydrology and Water Resources in Arizona and the Southwest* (Proceedings of the Hydrology session)
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13.10 -- These by-laws may be amended by a three-fourths vote of the membership present and voting at an annual business meeting, provided that notice of the proposed change has been sent to all members at least one month before such meeting.

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14.10 -- The rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised" govern the Academy in all cases to which they are applicable and consistent with the Articles of Incorporation and these by-laws.
